St. Mathieu Ecole Episcopale, Begin

<mark>A SAVING</mark> GRACE AMIDST TURMOIL

High in the remote southern mountains of Haiti sits a thriving school built and maintained by Good Shepherd Episcopal Church. Although Haiti's cities recently have experienced much unrest, in the tiny rural village of Bégin, St. Mathieu École Épiscopale is calm.

"Our school is an oasis in the storm," said Glenda Williams, chair of Tend My Lambs, the mission outreach at Good Shepherd. "Our students are safe, and people in the community can be safe at our school too."

The recent violence in Haiti underscores the struggle and anger of its urban young people who cannot find jobs. Many have insufficient education, and nearly all lack the income and ability to lead a productive life in their homeland. The demonstrations, an eruption of anger against Haitian president Jovenel Moïse, brought most of the country to a standstill earlier this year. Roads were blocked with burning tires, metal fencing, and cinder blocks. There were several casualties. United States' aid was stranded at the ports. With local businesses shut down, food, water, and propane gas became scarce. Even the raucous and beloved Carnival was cancelled. Tension remains high in Haiti, as confidence in the government is weak and people remain angry over corruption, economic malaise, and hunger.

The saving grace of HEF's schools, including St. Mathieu École Épiscopale, is location. Many people who live in the mountains are subsistence farmers, so they have more food and relative safety than those in the cities.

St. Mathieu École Épiscopale did close for nine days during the height of the uprising, since some of its teachers live in Port-au-Prince and couldn't get to Bégin. No vehicles were on the roads, and conditions were not safe. Even though Haiti is still tense and volatile, HEF's schools, like St. Mathieu, are operating smoothly.

The history of St. Mathieu École Épiscopale and Good Shepherd goes back 27 years. "Our church was called to build this school," said Glenda Williams. "We have watched the students flourish, but I have to say they have enriched us just as much as the school has enriched them. We have been blessed."

The relationship between the St. Mathieu and Good Shepherd has

lasted through hurricanes, earthquakes, and now, civil unrest. The original school, built in 1992, consisted of five elementary classrooms. Within five years, the school expanded to include middle school. A new church was built, and the combination of church and school became a place of hope for all the people of Bégin.

When the disastrous earthquake tore apart the island on January 12, 2010, St. Mathieu was partially standing, but unsafe and soon condemned. Good Shepherd decided to rebuild, and held a fundraising Fish Fry for Haiti. Generous proceeds were \$40,000, enough to rebuild the elementary and middle school, and add a high school. Within the year, the doors were reopened and the students and teachers returned.

Disaster could have struck again when Hurricane Matthew made landfall as a powerful Category 4 on October 4, 2016. But, St. Mathieu had been so strongly constructed that not only did it remain operational, but it served as a place of refuge for the community, just as it has done during the current national crisis.

Today, the school serves 214 elementary and 211 upper level students. The cost of tuition and books for these 425 students, plus the salaries of the 34 teachers, is about \$24,000 per year.

In mid-March, Good Shepherd held its annual Fish Fry for Haiti, to celebrate and support the Haitian school. In addition to money raised at the fish fry and its silent auction, St. Mathieu is sustained through scholarships provided by members of Good Shepherd and people in the Lake Charles community.

"Only \$135 provides tuition and supplies for one student for an entire year," Glenda said. "There is no one else. The Haitian government does not provide education for these children. U.S. churches of all denominations have taken on the task of educating the Haitians. We are humbly proud to serve this need."

Good Shepherd is seeking a partnership with another church to feed the children, which would cost a little more than the church's budget for education. Glenda said, "Such a partnership would be the answer to our prayers." SPONSORING A HEF SCHOOL

At this time, the Haiti Education Foundation supports 35 schools in the remote mountains of southern Haiti. The dream of our board is to match each school with an American partner. This benefits the children in Haiti as well as the sponsors! We have heard time and again of the severe poverty of Haiti and that these people so often feel forgotten. A sponsorship creates a relationship between the two entities. This relationship involves two basic tenants; a financial obligation and involvement with the school.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATION

We are requesting an investment of at least 50% of the financial need of the school be met by the sponsoring church or organization. Those needs are the salaries of teaching personnel and some supplies. We ask that you consider a 5 year sponsorship for our planning purposes, but we do not request any formal written document. The sponsorship amount is a set amount and we will not ask for any increase within that 5 year period.

INVOLVEMENT

Our hope is that a representation from your church or organization will personally visit the school, meet the children and their teachers. This allows donors to see how mission funds are being spent.

There are many needs within each school. As your relationship grows, our hope is that you will be led to seek the specific needs of your school. This is not a requirement of sponsorship but an outgrowth of your investment in the lives of these children

St. Matthias Elementary/Preschool, Cherident

St. Matthias Elementary and Preschool suffered much damage in the 2010 earthquake. Since that time, they have made the best of facilities made of plywood with tin roofs. This school is located on the site of our Guest House and is one of our largest schools. It will sit on the site of the original Frances Landers Tech. The total cost for the sixteen room concrete building is expected to be \$160,000.00. We have raised \$78,778.00 and have a donor who has agreed to work with us on matching donations for the remaining construction costs.

Prayer Concerns

Your prayers move mountains! There are several matters in Haiti that need your constant prayers:

- 1. Resolution to the political turmoil that has kept Haiti unstable for the past year. Many are starving and in need of help as the economic situation is in chaos.
- 2. Strengthening of the Episcopal Church of Haiti as they reorganize and elect a new bishop. This lays heavy on the hearts of the people in the communities that we serve. May they focus on God's plan and provision for each of them.
- 3. The leaders of our schools: Pere Jacob (St. Matthias Parish), Pere Junior (St. Marc Parish), Pere Rogenor (Ascension Parish), Pere Beauvoir (Christ Roi Parish), Pere Marie (Bon Berger).

 Pere Beauvoir was seriously burned in a fire while burning some trash. He is still in the hospital receiving treatment.
- 4. Ancy Fils Aime is our liaison in Haiti who is responsible for transportation, translation and countless other important jobs for HEF.
- 5. Students and teachers will have a successful end to this school year. They will take end of the year exams in mid-June.
